

What is a Scholarship?



In contrast to BAföG, which is also a form of educational support, a scholarship does not have to be paid back and is therefore not a financial burden after your graduation!

Financial Support (mostly regular, but also one-off)

Goal: Creating space for your studies and your commitment to social engagement



Non-material Support

- ✓ Seminars, workshops & lectures on the acquisition of key qualifications

- ✓ Exkursions and Summer Schools

General education, career orientation, personal development, creating opportunities for networking

Forms of Support



You often receive both after a scholarship approval. However, it is also possible to receive only non-material support. As you can see: With a scholarship, you are not necessarily taking anything away from financially needier students. There are also special scholarships, such as the social scholarship from the Studienstiftung OWL, which is aimed exclusively at students in financial need. However, it is generally not possible to do without the non-material support, as the funding organizations attach importance to you accepting at least some of the offers and getting involved. However, it is also not advisable to do without it, as the offers of non-material support will help you in many ways!



You have a good chance of receiving a scholarship if you ...

- have and achieve good school/study results
- have a wide range of interests and are motivated to think "outside the box" of your own subject area
- \checkmark get involved in and for society
- ✓ have goals for your future
- ✓ need financial support to get a good degree





"But I probably need very good grades", are you (still) thinking?

Very good grades certainly don't worsen your chances, but an application with good grades is definitely worthwhile!

Also important:

It is not just your grades that are taken into consideration, but also your subject, because: The grades with which you are among the top performers also depend to a large extent on the subject you are studying.

Academic Achievement Engagement Matching

But what counts as engagement? More than you might think!

School & University class/student representative, work in a project, competition participation, activity in student councils/the AStA, ...

Society

Collaboration in/at: associations, municipal projects & facilities, youth work, the (youth) fire department, ...

Politics

Involvement in university politics, in democratic political parties, organization of political events, ...

Church/Religion

Involvement in church youth work, at church congresses, ...

Sports Training youth teams, working as a referee, ...

Arts & Culture Organizing/being part of exhibitions, participation in theater projects, ...

Family

Looking after your own children, siblings, caring for relatives, the need to support the family financially...

Whether your application for a scholarship has a chance of success also depends on how well your application matches the profile of the foundation/funding organization that you want to support you:

You and the Förderwerk should be a good match!

You can only find out whether and how well you fit in with a funding organization by taking a close look at the values and goals that guide the various foundations and funding organizations. You should do this when pre-selecting suitable scholarships and thus prepare your application, as you should be able to justify why you are a good fit for a particular foundation/funding organization.





What funding organizations are there?



One starting point could be, for example, the scholarships of the Begabtenförderwerke, which are funded by the federal government.

However, there are also other scholarship programs funded by the federal government, such as the **Deutschlandstipendium** or the **Aufstiegsstipendium for vocationally qualified people from the Stiftung für berufliche Bildung**.

In addition to these funding organizations, there are many other larger and smaller funding organizations that may be suitable for you!

There are more than 2,000 scholarship providers in Germany alone.

Search for and find the right funding organization **TH**

Smaller and less well-known foundations in particular often have difficulties attracting applicants. It can therefore be extremely worthwhile to search outside of the better-known funding organizations.

As is so often the case, success in finding the right scholarship for you also depends on how clever and creative you are in your search. Also check whether there are any company funding programs that could be suitable for you.

A good starting point for your search is the <u>Stipendiendatenbank von e-fellows</u>, the websites of <u>arbeiterkind.de</u>, <u>Stipendium Plus</u>, but also the scholarship information day at the TH OWL!

Research is worthwhile, even if it takes time!

✓ Get an overview of funding foundations

- Stipendiumplus.de, etc.
- ✓ Check the websites of the foundations
 - Mission statement (values and goals)
- ✓ Seek advice

- Talentscouts, Career Service, scholarship officers
- ✓ Attend scholarship information days & workshops

✓ Get as muss information as possible from your favorite foundation(s)

- Deadlines, form of application and required documents
- ✓ Compile the necessary documents
 - Request expert statements at an early stage, prepare CV, certificates, attestations and letters of motivation
- ✓ Submit your application on time!

- ✓ These scholarships could be the right ones for me!
 - Does it make sense to submit multiple applications to different foundations?
- ✓ Consider who is eligible for expert statements

- ✓ Information on the procedure can be often be found on the website of the foundation
- ✓ Review your information on the foundation to be prepared
